The Southeast Regional Conservation Association (SERCA) founding mission is to assist caretakers of cultural property in responding to disasters and to help develop a working emergency preparedness plan for each collecting or historic organization in the southeast.

We provide opportunities for education, expanding skills, and collegial exchange between conservators and allied professionals involved in the preservation of cultural and heritage properties. SERCA strives to improve access to conservation expertise through member outreach activities to cultural repositories, particularly those with limited opportunities for professional conservation.

SERCA holds one annual meeting lasting 2-3 days, often with a workshop, and generally in early spring. Experts may present on featured topics or themes, possibly including a hands-on session and visit to local historic or cultural sites. Members participate in various social and networking opportunities. To help students, interns, or those not employed in the field, we also offer a scholarship to defray the cost of annual meeting attendance.
